



BIO **Dr. Jungmiwha S. Bullock, PhD** is currently the chief executive officer, founder, and philanthropist of J. S. Bullock & Associates, LLC | The Brokerage for Dreams™, an international education, professional, and philanthropy services consulting brokerage, which inspires, motivates, and bridges clients with their most unmet goals and dreams. In addition to her company, Dr. Bullock is also a renowned diversity consultant, expert, and guest speaker who has been interviewed on a number of nationally syndicated news programs and media outlets, including NPR, ABC, BBC, *Time Magazine*, *The Washington Post*, *USA Today*, *The Chicago Tribune*, and more. Currently, she is also a 2013-2015 Visiting Scholar at University of California at Berkeley working on her latest international study and book manuscript.

Dr. Bullock was recently honored in New York City for her achievements in education, diversity, and service with a National TRIO Achievers Award, selected by the Council for Opportunity in Education, supported by the U.S. Department of Education. One year prior she was also a recipient of the Regional TRIO Achiever Award from the Mid-Eastern Association of Educational Opportunity Program Personnel.

Prior to launching her company, Dr. Bullock completed a two-year federal postdoctoral appointment for the United States Department of Commerce, U.S. Census Bureau in Washington, DC. During her tenure, she produced a number of projects and publications including, "The Two or More Races Population, Census 2010"—the first ever decade comparison report of the multiracial population in the United States since 1790. While serving in her appointment, she also presented other cutting-edge work around the world, which looked at topics pertaining to ethnomedical research, mental health disparities, race and politics, among other policy related research.

A social scientist by training, Jungmiwha Bullock completed her PhD at the University of Southern California in the interdisciplinary Department of American Studies & Ethnicity, with primary fields in Sociology and Political Science. Her dissertation entitled, *Multiracial Politics or the Politics of Being Multiracial?: Racial Theory, Civic Engagement, and Socio-Political Participation in a Contemporary Society*, grapples with the complexities about how race, ethnicity, and nationality are discussed within a social justice framework. She also holds a masters degree in international education and policy from New York University, and undergraduate degrees in communications and business from Pennsylvania State University. Today, she continues to have the honor of instructing several courses and workshops across the humanities and social sciences.

Professionally, Dr. Bullock has served in several leadership positions over the years on the local, state, and national levels. Most notably from 2003 until 2010, she served as an executive board member of the Association of MultiEthnic Americans (AMEA); the oldest, leading, national umbrella advocacy association dedicated to multiracial, multiethnic, and transracially adopted individuals, families, organizations, communities and allies. In 2006, she was elected president of AMEA, serving for five years, and simultaneously appointed to the Decennial Census Advisory Committee (DCAC) representing nearly 10 million people self-identified as "two or more races" in the United States. Concurrently, she served as the Vice-President of the Media Image Coalition (MIC) for the Los Angeles County Commission on Human Relations; an organization dedicated to combating biased representations of America's diverse/historically underrepresented populations in film, television, radio, and emerging mediums.

Jungmiwha Bullock has had the honor of teaching, coordinating, and creating innovative programs to individuals, organizations, businesses, institutions, and governmental agencies. Most notably, she has and continues to serve as a leading diversity outreach consultant and advocate working with top administrators at leading institutions to assess, develop, and coordinate renowned outreach programs. Programs have included the likes of the Ronald E. McNair Scholars Program, the Enhancing Diversity in Graduate Education (EDGE) Program sponsored by the National Science Foundation, the Academic and Professional Development Institute at USC, and the First-year Institute for Research Socialization and Training (FIRST), among others.

Outside of higher education, Dr. Bullock has continued to have a strong commitment to service. She has, among other accolades, raised thousands of dollars for the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society/Team in Training, the Melanoma Education Foundation, and other charities through high endurance marathons and races; dedicated countless time and energy in New Orleans rebuilding homes, playgrounds, and has even team-led an initiative to restore Pontchartrain Park, a historically Black ballpark devastated by Katrina with the Coca-Cola Scholars Foundation; helped to coordinate the largest Day Before Thanksgiving events for five consecutive years in downtown Los Angeles for underserved, homeless and displaced children, adults, and families; and provided countless hours of service in programs for communities from all walks of life. She spends time inspiring and mentoring youth in alternative school systems and correctional facilities towards earning advanced degrees and to improve their life chances. In 2014, she is gearing up to ride 525 miles by bike from San Francisco to Los Angeles for the California Coast Classic to raise awareness and money for the Arthritis Foundation, participating in Tour de Pier to raise attention about pancreatic cancer, and running the Los Angeles Marathon.

Today, outside of her social entrepreneurship, she continues her professional work through two particular book projects. The first project is a global research study that investigates the experiences of multiracial children orphaned by military personnel around the world. Her other book, *Am I Half Giraffe*, debuts on Lexique Du Monde Press as the first quintilingual children's book on the market, written in English, French, Spanish, Korean, and Afrikaans. With these projects and more, her goal is to continue to serve as one of the leading advocates and experts on multiracial identity, as well as, social justice and equality around the world.
